Summary Report

On October 9th, two dozen individuals representing 20 businesses and organizations from the Greater Trail area participated in a circular economy-based, business opportunities workshop, part of Canada's National Industrial Symbiosis Program (NISP® Canada). The special facilitation approach used at this event enabled participants to elaborate on their respective waste and resource management challenges, which were in turn shared with all participants. The result: **86 distinct resources** were discussed by the workshop participants, and **63 potential matches** were captured. As well, participants were referred to an additional dozen businesses not in attendance on the day, further expanding the regional NISP® network. The NISP® Canada team would like to thank all the participants and volunteers who made this event a success, particularly the staff of the Lower Columbia Initiatives Corporation who helped plan and facilitate the event.
